REFLECTIONS

In today's Gospel passage from Mark we hear Jesus once again talking about the "kingdom". And in particular, we hear Jesus describing how this kingdom will develop and grow --- from something the size of a little mustard seed to something much larger, something that provides a kind of shade for creatures to dwell in. His point seems to be that from almost nothing something wonderful can blossom, from little can come much, from the invisible can come something visible and beautiful and helpful and necessary.

That sounds pretty wonderful, doesn't it? It brings us comfort to think about God bringing about whatever it is that God wants to bring about --- that God will see to it that the world gets everything it needs to become the beautiful place he created it to be. God will do everything --- make sure the seed is sown, the seed is watered, the ground is nourished, the sun will shine, and the kingdom will grow in unimaginable ways. Fr. Peter

DEAR PADRE,

WHY DID JESUS ALWAYS SPEAK IN PARABLES? WHY DIDN'T HE GIVE US CLEARER ANSWERS?

Why did Jesus always speak in parables? Why didn't he give us clearer answers? Parables are short, relatable stories. Their simple images or comparisons convey a moral or religious lesson and put us in touch with the mystery of God and ourselves. Thus, parables confront the hearer or reader with a radical choice to enter



God's kingdom: "One must enter the kingdom, that is, become a disciple of Christ, in order to 'know the secrets of the kingdom of heaven' (Matthew 13:11). For those who stay 'outside,' everything remains enigmatic" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 546). About a third of Jesus' recorded teachings are in parable form. After the Pharisees rejected Jesus (Matthew 12:14), he immediately changed his straightforward preaching to parables. This fulfilled what was spoken by the prophet: "I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation [of the world]" (Matthew 13:35; see Psalm 78:2). Parables are intended to reveal as much about us as they do about God. As John Shea writes in Stories of God, "God not only loves to hear our stories. God loves to tell stories. And, quite simply, we are the story God tells." In the telling, we ourselves are told. The timeless, universal stories of Jesus speak to us at different stages of life and provide multiple levels of meaning to the openhearted.

LIFE HAPPENS

The adage that "life is what happens to us as we're busy doing other things" seems to be a rewording of this week's Gospel about the kingdom of heaven, namely about God's reigning activity in our lives. It is a parable about a man who sows seeds in his field. The seeds sprout, grow, and bear fruit, all without his knowing how. In effect, the message says that it is God who happens to us as we're busy doing other things. We tend to convince ourselves that we have complete control over our lives, when in reality that is somewhat of an illusion. Though we may decide what we will have for dinner, what TV program to watch, or what we will wear, we have much less control over the portions of life that so often give meaning and shape to who we are. The person someone marries is dependent upon the mutual commitment of the two people in love. The degree of job satisfaction we eagerly hope to find can partly depend upon the people with whom we work and the expectations of others. "We walk by faith and not by sight" reveals that we recognize the reigning presence of God bringing us to a life we'd never imagined. In reality, the one thing we do have control over is how we respond to life's events, which can then open us to the ways by which God brings us to fruitful abundance.



What does "Kingdom of God" mean?

The kingdom of God isn't "heaven"—that is, it's not where we go when we die. It's not even a place. Kingdom refers to God's rule. Jesus refers to the Kingdom as "among" us and "within" us—always within reach. We don't "get there" so much as abide in it where we are. We participate in the Kingdom in various ways: changing our hearts, working toward justice, protecting the vulnerable, and freeing the burdened. We pray for the Kingdom to come in the Lord's Prayer.

Jesus offers stories and metaphors for understanding the Kingdom: a sower, a mustard seed, a treasure, a banquet. Matthew's gospel references the Kingdom almost 50 times. John's gospel makes clear that the Kingdom isn't territory to be gained. It's where peace rules and oppression ends. No political system or social program can establish God's rule. We can't make "Kingdom come" by our own efforts. Yet we're summoned to enter more fully into the Kingdom by reshaping society to conform to its values.
